HeLP's goal is to improve the health and well-being of low-income children and their families through the combined efforts of medical and legal experts.

HeLP is a project of Georgia State University's College of Law, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta and the Atlanta Legal Aid Society.

Children's Healthcare of Atlanta has welcomed **HeLP** lawyers and staff at Children's Healthcare campuses at Egleston, Scottish Rite and Hughes Spalding. **HeLP** lawyers and staff are on hand to offer free legal services for low-income children and their families.

What are some ways that HeLP can assist me?

HeLP can assist you with legal problems with:

Public Benefits — Medicaid, food stamps, SSI, TANF, WIC.

Family Stability — domestic violence, child support, paternity,

legitimation, adoptions, custody and visitation, birth certificate issues.

Housing — including housing code violations, unsafe or unsanitary living conditions, public housing and Section 8 issues, private landlord-tenant issues, energy and utility concerns

Education — special education and disability accommodations

Employment — family medical leave, wage

claims.

Permanency Planning & Consent for Care — drafting wills, advance directives, guardianships.

Who is eligible for HeLP?

If you have a child who receives care at Children's, you are eligible for free legal service from **HeLP** if:

- Your family lives at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.
- Your child is less than 21 years of age.

- Your legal problem is a type that can be handled by **HeLP**.

If your family does not meet these standards, you may be referred to volunteer lawyers or other suitable resources.

How do I contact HeLP?

If you need help with legal matters and agree to become a client of **HeLP**:

- Ask your child's doctor, nurse or social worker to contact the **HeLP** staff for you.
- You may contact **HeLP** staff yourself at 404-705-0000. You do not need a referral from a doctor or hospital staff.

HeLP staff can assist patients and families with basic civil legal problems that affect a child's health.
